## NATIONAL WESTMINSTER BANK

The National Westminster Bank Football Club was formed in 1970, following the merger of the National Provincial, Westminster and District Banks. In the first season, 1970-71, seven teams played in the Southern Amateur League, six in the London Banks League and we fielded a Veterans XI.

In the 1985-86 season history was made when our First Team won the Southern Amateur League First Team Section Division One. In the same season they lifted the London Banks' Challenge Cup and the London Banks' Six-a-Side Trophy. More recently, in 1991-92, our Fifteen Team completed the 'treble' of the Southern Amateur League Fifth Team Section Division One, the A.F.A. Senior Novets Challenge Cup and the London Banks' Minor Cup.

During this season the Bank has fielded a total of 14 teams with nine competing in the Southern Amateur League, three competing in the London Banks' League, a Veterans team and a Sunday Friendly XI.

## OLD HAMPTONIANS

The Old Hamptonians Association was founded in 1908. Its Clubhouse and Sports Ground are situated adjacent to the parent School at Rectory Farm, Dean Road, Hampton. Reflecting the quality of the facilities, during recent years they have been used for Representative matches by both the Amateur Football Alliance and the Old Boys' Football League.

The Association's sporting successes have increased during the last two decades. As well as the Football Club, both Rugby and Cricket Clubs continue to prosper. The Football Club was a Member of the Nemean League until its closure in the early 1980's, whence the Club joined the Old Boys' Football League.

Prior to last season Old Hamptonians F.C.'s one success of any note was to win the London Old Boys' Senior Cup in 1956-57, beating Old Fincunians 2-1. However, the past year has been a watershed for the Club as a whole. Each of our four sides achieved promotion: our 1st XI for the second successive year, our 2nd and 3rd XI's as Divisional Champions, and our 4th XI for the third consecutive season. In addition to this, last season the 2nd XI won both the A.F.A. Intermediate (2-0 v Old Esthamecians) and Middlesex A.F.A. Intermediate Cups (2-1 v Winchmore Hill after extra time in a replay). These were the Club's first successes in any A.F.A. competition.

With a continue growth in strength and depth (we now run 5 league sides - not quite as many as today's opponents !!) this season has provided further success. As well as reaching the A.F.A. Senior Cup Final for the first time, our 1st XI are close to promotion to the Premier Division of the O.B.F.L. in what has proved to be an exceptional season
