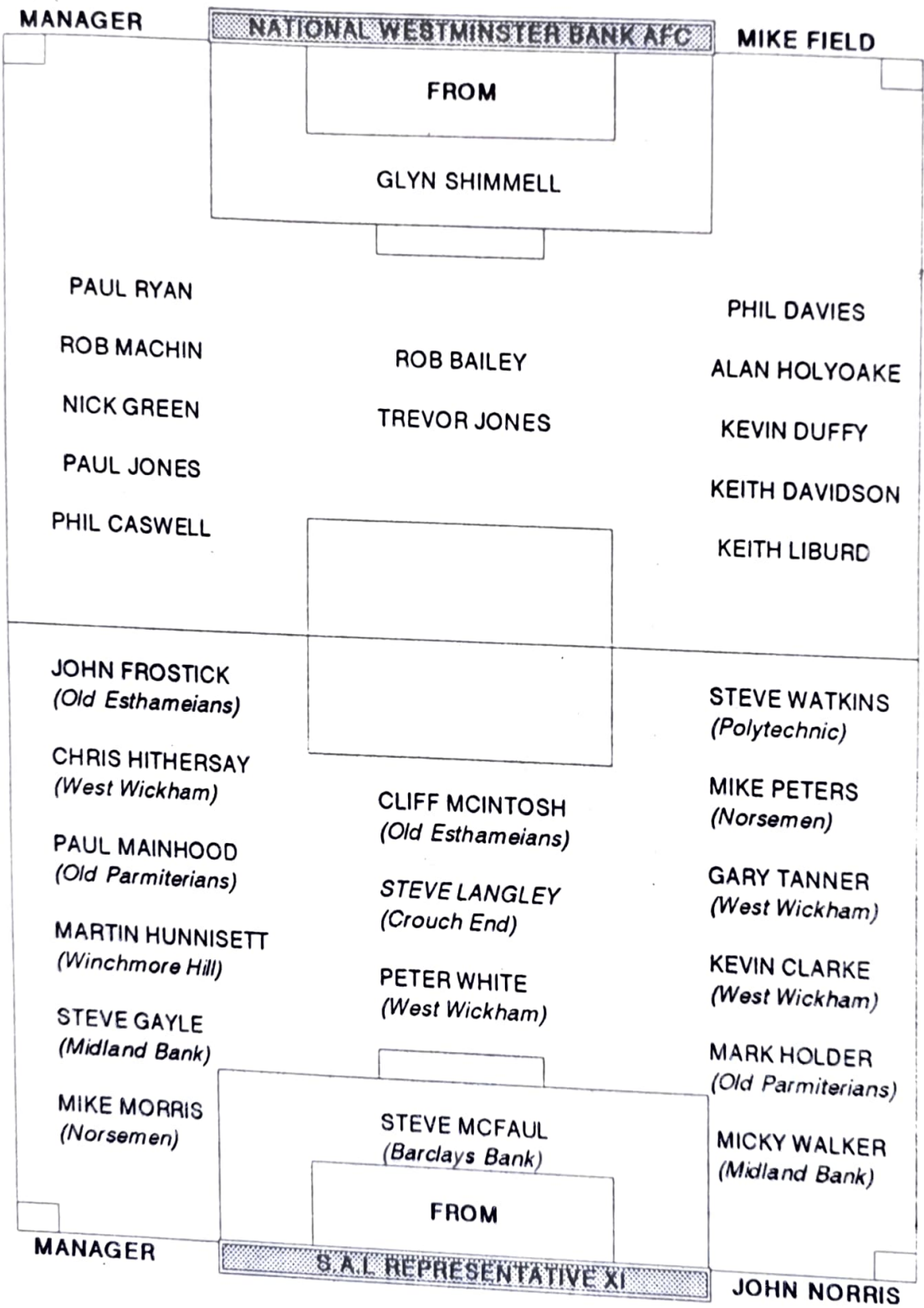
The toilets of Bromley FC could not be rated, because they shared grounds with Dulwich Hamlet this year, due to a fire last summer.
