# NATIONAL WESTMINSTER BANK

The Club was formed in 1970, following the merger of the National Provincial, Westminster and District Banks. In its first season, 1970-71, seven teams played in the Southern Amateur League, six in the London Banks League and a Veterans' XI was also fielded.

In 1979 the Club reached a peak of running 18 sides each Saturday. Although no longer boasting the same number of players, it still ranks as one of the biggest in amateur football, fielding 12 League sides, a Veterans' and Sunday teams during the current campaign.

The first Senior Cup Final was reached at the end of season 1977-78, losing 1-3 to Kew Association. However, the 1992-93 season saw the 1st. team achieve an unprecedented treble by winning the Southern Amateur League Division 1 Championship, the A.F.A. Surrey Senior Cup and a first success in the A.F.A. Senior Cup.

That Senior Cup Final, drawn at 2-2, went to a replay against Old Hamptonians, when Natwest ran out convincing winners a week later. Several of the players on show in those games of last season are making another appearance today.

This season is the Silver Jubilee season, and the Club can look back on a proud history marked by triumphs at all levels, during the first 25 years. A victory today would be a magnificent way to celebrate the anniversary.
